- 1.1 The Kenya National Commission for UNESCO invites sealed bids from eligible tenderers registered with IATA for provision of air ticketing services for a period of three years through framework agreement.
- 1.2 Interested eligible candidates may obtain further information from and inspect the tender documents from the office of the Head of Supply Chain Management at the KNATCOM offices, located at National Bank Building, 15th floor, Harambee Avenue between 9.00am and 4.00pm during weekdays.
- 1.3 An electronic copy of the tender document may be obtained by interested firms upon payment of a non-refundable fee of **Kshs. 1000** payable to our accounts office in cash or bankers cheque. The document can also be viewed and downloaded from the website www.unesco.go.ke free **of charge or at no cost.** Bidders who download the tender document from the website MUST forward their particulars immediately for records and any further tender clarifications and addenda to address provided at appendix to instruction to tenderers.
- 1.4 Tenders MUST be accompanied by a tender security of Kshs. 100,000.00 specified in format provided in the tender document or dully filled, signed and stamped Tender Securing Declaration Form for AGPO registered groups in the format provided.
- 1.5 Completed tender documents are to be enclosed in plain sealed envelopes marked with tender name and tender reference number and be deposited in the Tender Box at KNATCOM Offices in the 14th floor, located at National Building, Harambee Avenue or be addressed to;

SECTION II – INSTRUCTIONS TO TENDERERS

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SECTION II INSTRUCTIONS TO TENDERERS

2.1 Eligible tenderers

- 2.1.1. This Invitation to tender is open to <u>all tenderers registered with IATA & KATA</u> as described in the instructions to tenderers. Successful tenderers shall provide the services for the stipulated duration from the date of commencement (hereinafter referred to as the term) specified in the tender documents.
- 2.1.2. KNATCOM employees, committee members, board members and their relative (spouse and children) are not eligible to participate in the tender unless where specially allowed under section 131 of the Act.
- 2.1.3. Tenderers shall provide the qualification information statement that the tenderer (including all members, of a joint venture and subcontractors) is not associated, or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the KNATCOM to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the services under this Invitation for tenders.
- **2.1.4.** Tenderers involved in corrupt or fraudulent practices or debarred from participating in public procurement shall not be eligible.

2.2 Cost of tendering

- **2.2.1** The Tenderer shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its tender, and the KNATCOM, will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the tendering process.
- **2.2.2** The price to be charged for the tender document shall be **Kshs. 1000.00** or free of charge for bidders that download from KNATCOM Website.

2.3 Contents of tender documents

- 2.3.1. The tender document comprises of the documents listed below and addenda issued in accordance with clause 6 of these instructions to tenders
 - i) Instructions to tenderers
 - ii) General Conditions of Contract
 - iii) Special Conditions of Contract
 - iv) Schedule of Requirements
 - v) Details of service
 - vi) Form of tender
 - vii) Price schedules
 - viii) Confidential business questionnaire form
 - ix) Declaration of undertaking
 - x) Tender Security Form
 - xi) Tender Securing bid declaration form

xii) Power of Attorney

2.3.2. The Tenderer is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the tender documents. Failure to furnish all information required by the tender documents or to submit a tender not substantially responsive to the tender documents in every respect will be at the tenderers risk and may result in the rejection of its tender.

2.4 Clarification of Documents

2.4.1. A prospective candidate making inquiries of the tender document may notify the KNATCOM in writing or by post, fax or email at the entity's address

indicated in the Invitation for tenders. The KNATCOM will respond in writing to any request for

clarification of the tender documents, which it receives no later than seven (7) days prior to the deadline for the submission of tenders, prescribed by the KNATCOM. Written copies of

the Procuring entities response (including an explanation of the query but without identifying the source of inquiry) will be sent to all prospective tenderers who have received the tender documents

2.4.2. The KNATCOM shall reply to any clarifications sought by the tenderer within 3 days of receiving the request to enable the tenderer to make timely submission of its tender

2.5 Amendment of documents

- 2.5.1. At any time prior to the deadline for submission of tenders. KNATCOM. any reason, whether initiative or for at itsown in response To clarification requested by a prospective tenderer, may modify tender documents issuing addendum. the by an
- 2.5.2. All prospective tenderers who have obtained the tender documents will be notified of the amendment by post, fax or email and such amendment will be binding on them.
- 2.5.3. In order to allow prospective tenderers reasonable time in which to take the amendment into account in preparing their tenders, the KNATCOM, at its discretion, may extend the deadline for the submission of tenders.

2.6 Language of tender

2.6.1. The tender prepared by the tenderer, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the tender exchanged by the tenderer and the KNATCOM, shall be written in English language. Any printed literature furnished by the tenderer may be written in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate English translation of the relevant passages in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the tender, the English translation shall govern.

2.7 **Documents Comprising the Tender**

The tender prepared by the tenderer shall comprise the following components:

- (a) A Tender Form and a Price Schedule completed in accordance with paragraph 9, 10 and 11 below.
- (b) Documentary evidence established in accordance with Clause 2.11 that the tenderer is eligible to tender and is qualified to perform the contract if its tender is accepted;
- (c) Tender securing declaration form
- (d)Confidential business questionnaire
- e) Declaration form not to engage in corrupt fraudulent practice

2.8 Form of Tender

2.8.1 The tenderers shall complete the Form of Tender and the appropriate Price Schedule furnished in the tender documents, indicating the services to be performed.

2.9 Tender Prices

- 2.9.1 The tenderer shall indicate on the Price schedule the unit prices where applicable and total tender prices of the services it proposes to provide under the contract.
- 2.9.2 Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be the cost of the services quoted including all customs duties and VAT and other taxes payable:
- 2.9.3 Prices quoted by the tenderer shall remain fixed during the term of the contract unless otherwise agreed by the parties. A tender submitted with an adjustable price quotation will be treated as non-responsive and will be rejected, pursuant to paragraph 2.22.
- 2.9.4 Contract price variations shall not be allowed for contracts not exceeding one year (12 months)
- 2.9.5 Where contract price variation is allowed, the variation shall not exceed 10% of the original contract price.
- 2.9.6 Price variation requests shall be processed by the KNATCOM within 30 days of receiving the request.

2.10 Tender Currencies

2.10.1 Prices shall be quoted in Kenya Shillings unless otherwise specified in the appendix to in Instructions to Tenderers.

2.11 Tenderers Eligibility and Qualifications.

2.11.1 Pursuant to Clause 2.1 the tenderer shall furnish, as part of its tender, documents establishing the tenderers eligibility to tender and its qualifications to perform the contract if its tender is accepted.

2.11.2 The documentary evidence of the tenderers qualifications to perform the contract if its tender is accepted shall establish to KNATCOM satisfaction that the tenderer has the financial and technical capability necessary to perform the contract.

2.12 **Tender Security**

- 2.12.1 The tenderer shall furnish, as part of its tender, a tender security for the amount specified in the Appendix to Invitation to Tenderers/ Tender Securing Declaration form for AGPO registered firms.
- 2.12.2 The tender security shall be in the amount of **Ksh. 100,000.00** in the form of insurance or a bank guarantee.
- 2.12.2 The tender security is required to protect the KNATCOM against the risk of Tenderer's conduct which would warrant the security's forfeiture, pursuant to paragraph 2.12.7
- 2.12.4 Any tender not secured in accordance with paragraph 2.12.1 and 2.12.3 will be rejected by the KNATCOM as non-responsive, pursuant to paragraph 2.20
- 2.12.5 Unsuccessful tenderer's security will be discharged or returned as promptly as possible but not later than thirty (30) days after the expiration of the period of tender validity prescribed by the KNATCOM.
- 2.12.6 The successful tenderer's tender security will be discharged upon the tenderer signing the contract, pursuant to paragraph 2.29, and furnishing the performance security, pursuant to paragraph 2.30.
- 2.12.7 The tender security may be forfeited:
 - (a) If a tenderer **withdraws** its tender **during** the period of tender validity specified by the KNATCOM on the

Tender Form; or

- (b) In the case of a successful tenderer, *if* the tenderer fails:
- (i) to sign the contract in accordance with paragraph 30

or

- (ii) to furnish performance security in accordance with paragraph 31.
- (c) If the tenderer rejects, correction of an error in the tender.

2.13 Validity of Tenders

- 2.13.1 Tenders shall remain valid for **120 days** or as specified in the invitation to tender after date of tender opening prescribed by the KNATCOM, pursuant to paragraph 2.18. A tender valid for a shorter period shall be rejected by the KNATCOM as nonresponsive.
- 2.13.2 In exceptional circumstances, the KNATCOM may solicit the Tenderer's consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the responses thereto shall be made in writing. The tender security provided under paragraph 2.12 shall also be suitably extended. A tenderer may refuse the request without forfeiting its tender security. A tenderer granting the request will not be required nor permitted to modify its tender.

2.14 Format and Signing of Tender

- 2.14.1 The tenderer shall prepare two copies of the tender, clearly / marking each —ORIGINAL TENDER and —COPY OF TENDER, as appropriate. In the event of any discrepancy between them, the original shall govern.
- 2.14.2 The original and all copies of the tender shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by the tenderer or a person or persons duly authorized to bind the tenderer to the contract. All pages of the tender, except for unamended printed literature, shall be initialed by the person or persons signing the tender.
- 2.14.3 The tender shall have no interlineations, erasures, or overwriting except as necessary to correct errors made by the tenderer, in which case such corrections shall be initialed by the person or persons signing the tender.

2.15 Sealing and Marking of Tenders

- 2.15.1 The tenderer shall seal the original and each copy of the tender in separate envelopes, duly marking the envelopes as —ORIGINAL and —COPY. The envelopes shall then be sealed in an outer envelope. The inner and outer envelopes shall:
 - (a) be addressed to the KNATCOM at the address given in the invitation to tender
 - (b) bear, tender number and name in the invitation to tender and the words: —DO NOT OPEN BEFORE Tuesday 25th February, 2020, at 12:00 Noon
- 2.15.3 The inner envelopes shall also indicate the name and address of the tenderer to enable the tender to be returned unopened in case it is declared —late||. —
- 2.15.4 If the outer envelope is not sealed and marked as required by paragraph 2.15.2, the KNATCOM will assume no responsibility for the tender's misplacement or premature opening.

2.16 **Deadline for Submission of Tenders**

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- 2.16.1 Tenders must be received by the M at the address specified under paragraph 2.15.2 no later than **Tuesday 25th February**, **2020**, **at 12:00 Noon**.
- 2.16.2 The KNATCOM may, at its discretion, extend this deadline for the submission of tenders by amending the tender documents in accordance with paragraph 6, in which case all rights and obligations of the KNATCOM and candidates previously subject to the deadline will thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.
- 2.16.3 Bulky tenders which will not fit in the tender box shall be received by the KNATCOM as provided for in the appendix.

2.17 Modification and withdrawal of tenders

- 2.17.1 The tenderer may modify or withdraw its tender after the tender's submission, provided that written notice of the modification, including substitution or withdrawal of the tender's is received by the KNATCOM prior to the deadline prescribed for the submission of tenders.
- 2.17.2 The Tenderer's modification or withdrawal notice shall be prepared, sealed, marked, and dispatched in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 2.15. A withdrawal notice may also be sent by cable, but followed by a signed confirmation copy, postmarked not later than the deadline for submission of tenders.
- 2.17.3 No tender may be modified after the deadline for submission of tenders.
- 2.17.4 No tender may be withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submission of tenders and the expiration of the period of tender validity specified by the tenderer on the Tender Form. Withdrawal of a tender during this interval may result in the Tenderer's forfeiture of its tender security, pursuant to paragraph 2.12.7.
- 2.17.5 The KNATCOM may at any time terminate procurement proceedings before contract award and shall not be liable to any person for the termination.
- 2.17.6 The KNATCOM shall give prompt notice of the termination to the tenderers and on request give its reasons for termination within 14 days of receiving the request from any tenderer.

2.18 **Opening of Tenders**

2.18.1 The KNATCOM will open all tenders in the presence of tenderers' representatives who choose to attend, at **Tuesday 25th February**, **2020**, **at 12:00 Noon** and in the location specified in the invitation to tender. The tenderers' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance.

- 2.18.3 The tenderers' names, tender modifications or withdrawals, tender prices, discounts, and the presence or absence of requisite tender security and such other details as the KNATCOM, at its discretion, may consider appropriate, will be announced at the opening.
- 2.18.4 The KNATCOM will prepare minutes of the tender opening which will be submitted to the tenderers that signed the tender opening register and will have made the request.

2.19 Clarification of tenders

- 2.19.1 To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of tenders the KNATCOM may at its discretion, ask the tenderer for a clarification of its tender. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing, and no change in the prices or substance shall be sought, offered, or permitted.
- 2.19.2 Any effort by the tenderer to influence the KNATCOM in KNATCOM tender evaluation, tender comparison or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of the tenderers tender.

2.20 Preliminary Examination and Responsiveness

- 2.20.1 The KNATCOM will examine the tenders to determine whether they are complete, whether any computational errors have been made, whether required securities have been furnished whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the tenders are generally in order.
- 2.20.2 Arithmetical errors will be rectified on the following basis. If there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price shall prevail, and the total price shall be corrected. If the candidate does not accept the correction of the errors, its tender will be rejected, and its tender security may be forfeited. If there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words will prevail.
- 2.20.3 The KNATCOM may waive any minor informality or nonconformity or irregularity in a tender which does not constitute a material deviation, provided such waiver does not prejudice or affect the relative ranking of any tenderer.
- 2.20.4 Prior to the detailed evaluation, pursuant to paragraph 23, the KNATCOM will determine the substantial responsiveness of each tender to the tender documents. For purposes of these paragraphs, a substantially responsive tender is one which conforms to all the terms and conditions of the tender documents without material deviations. KNATCOM determination of a tender's responsiveness is to be based on the contents of the tender itself without recourse to extrinsic evidence.
- 2.20.5 If a tender is not substantially responsive, it will be rejected by the KNATCOM and may not subsequently be made responsive by the tenderer by correction of the nonconformity.

2.21 Conversion to a single currency

- 2.21.1 Where other currencies are used, the KNATCOM will convert those currencies to Kenya shillings using the selling exchange rate on the date of tender closing provided by the Central Bank of Kenya.
- 2.22 Evaluation and comparison of tenders.
- 2.22.1 The KNATCOM will evaluate and compare the tenders which have been determined to be substantially responsive, pursuant to paragraph 2.20
- 2.22.2 The comparison shall be of the price including all costs as well as duties and taxes payable on all the materials to be used in the provision of the services.
- 2.22.3 KNATCOM evaluation of a tender will take into account, in addition to the tender price, the following factors, in the manner and to the extent indicated in paragraph 2.22.4 and in the technical specifications:
 - (a) operational plan proposed in the tender;
 - (b) deviations in payment schedule from that specified in the Special Conditions of Contract;
- 2.22.4 Pursuant to paragraph 22.3 the following evaluation methods will be applied:
 - (a) Operational Plan.

The KNATCOM requires that the services under the Invitation for Tenders shall be performed at the time specified in the Schedule of Requirements. Tenders offering to perform longer than KNATCOM required delivery time will be treated as non-responsive and rejected.

(b) Deviation in payment schedule.

Tenderers shall state their tender price for the payment on a schedule outlined in the special conditions of contract. Tenders will be evaluated on the basis of this base price. Tenderers are, however, permitted to state an alternative payment schedule and indicate the reduction in tender price they wish to offer for such alternative payment schedule. The KNATCOM may consider the alternative payment schedule offered by the selected tenderer.

- 2.22.5 The tender evaluation committee shall evaluate the tender within 30 days from the date of opening the tender.
- 2.22.6 To qualify for contract awards, the tenderer shall have the following:-
 - (a) Necessary qualifications, capability experience, services, equipment and facilities to provide what is being procured.

- (b) Legal capacity to enter into a contract for procurement
- (c) Shall not be insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or in the process of being wound up and is not the subject of legal proceedings relating to the foregoing
- (d) Shall not be debarred from participating in public procurement.

2.23. Contacting KNATCOM

- 2.23.1 Subject to paragraph 2.19, no tenderer shall contact KNATCOM on any matter relating to its tender, from the time of the tender opening to the time the contract is awarded.
- 2.23.2 Any effort by a tenderer to influence the KNATCOM in its decisions on tender evaluation tender comparison or contract award may result in the rejection of the tenderers tender.

2.24 Award of Contract

a) Post qualification

- 2.24.1 In the absence of pre-qualification, the KNATCOM will determine to its satisfaction whether the tenderer that is selected as having submitted the lowest evaluated responsive tender is qualified to perform the contract satisfactorily.
- 2.24.2 The determination will take into account the tenderer's financial and technical capabilities. It will be based upon an examination of the documentary evidence of the tenderers qualifications submitted by the tenderer, pursuant to paragraph 2.1.2, as well as such other information as the KNATCOM deems necessary and appropriate.
- 2.24.3 An affirmative determination will be a prerequisite for award of the contract to the tenderer. A negative determination will result in rejection of the Tenderer's tender, in which event the KNATCOM will proceed to the next lowest evaluated tender to make a similar determination of that Tenderer's capabilities to perform satisfactorily.

b) Award Criteria

- 2.24.3 Subject to paragraph 2.29 the KNATCOM will award the contract to the successful tenderer whose tender has been determined to be substantially responsive and has been determined to be the lowest evaluated tender, provided further that the tenderer is determined to be qualified to perform the contract satisfactorily.
- 2.24.4 The KNATCOM reserves the right to accept or reject any tender and to annul the tendering process and reject all tenders at any time prior to contract award, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected tenderer or tenderers or any obligation to inform the affected tenderer or tenderers of the grounds for KNATCOM action. If the KNATCOM determines that none of the tenderers is responsive; the KNATCOM shall notify each tenderer who submitted a tender.

2.24.5 A tenderer who gives false information in the tender document about its qualification or who refuses to enter into a contract after notification of contract award shall be considered for debarment from participating in future public procurement.

2.25 Notification of award

- 2.25.1 Prior to the expiration of the period of tender validity, the Procuring entity will notify the successful tenderer in writing that its tender has been accepted.
- 2.25.2 The notification of award will signify the formation of the Contract subject to the signing of the contract between the tenderer and the KNATCOM pursuant to clause 2.29. Simultaneously the other tenderers shall be notified that their tenders have not been successful.
- 2.25.3 Upon the successful Tenderer's furnishing of the performance security pursuant to paragraph 31, the KNATCOM will promptly notify each unsuccessful Tenderer and will discharge its tender security, pursuant to paragraph 2.12

2.26 Signing of Contract

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- 2.26.1 At the same time as the COM notifies the successful tenderer that its tender has been accepted, the KNATCOM will simultaneously inform the other tenderers that their tenders have not been successful.
- 2.26.2 Within fourteen (14) days of receipt of the Contract Form, the successful tenderer shall sign and date the contract and return it to the KNATCOM.
- 2.26.3 The parties to the contract shall have it signed within 30 days from the date of notification of contract award unless there is an administrative review request.

2.27 **Performance Security**

- 2.27.1 Within thirty (30) days of the receipt of notification of award from the KNATCOM, the successful tenderer shall furnish the performance security in accordance with the Conditions of Contract, in the Performance Security Form provided in the tender documents, or in another form acceptable to the KNATCOM.
- 2.27.2 Failure of the successful tenderer to comply with the requirement of paragraph 2.29 or paragraph 2.30.1 shall constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award and forfeiture of the tender security, in which event the KNATCOM may make the award to the next lowest evaluated or call for new tenders.2.28 **Corrupt or Fraudulent Practices**
- 2.28.1 The KNATOM requires that tenderers observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and execution of

contracts. A tenderer shall sign a declaration that he has not and will not be involved in corrupt or fraudulent practices.

2.28.2 The KNATCOM will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the tenderer recommended

for award has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the contract in question;

2.28.3 Further, a tenderer who is found to have indulged in corrupt or fraudulent practices risks being debarred from participating in public procurement in Kenya.

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SECTION III GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

3.1 **Definitions**

In this contract the following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- a) —The contract means the agreement entered into between the KNATCOM and the tenderer as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- b) —The Contract Price means the price payable to the tenderer under the Contract for the full and proper performance of its contractual obligations.
- c) —The services means services to be provided by the contractor including materials and incidentals which the tenderer is required to provide to the GDC under the Contract.
- d) —The KNATCOM means the organization sourcing for the services under this Contract.
- e) —The contractor means the individual or firm providing the services under this Contract.
- f) —GCC means general conditions of contract contained in this section
- g) —SCC means the special conditions of contract
- h) —Day∥ means calendar day

3.2 **Application**

These General Conditions shall apply to the extent that they are not superceded by provisions of other part of contract.

3.3 Standards

3.3.1 The services provided under this Contract shall conform to the 7 standards mentioned in the Schedule of requirements

3.4 Patent Right's

The tenderer shall indemnify the KNATCOM against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design tights arising from use of the services under the contract or any part thereof.

3.5 **Performance Security**

3.5.1 Within twenty eight (28) days of receipt of the notification of Contract award, the successful tenderer shall furnish to the KNATCOM the performance security where applicable in the amount specified in Special Conditions of Contract.

- 3.5.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the KNATCOM as compensation for any loss resulting from the Tenderer's failure to complete its obligations under the Contract.
- 3.5.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the Contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the KNATCOM and shall be in the form of:
 - a) Cash.
 - b) A bank guarantee.
 - c) Such insurance guarantee approved by the Authority.
 - d) Letter of credit.
- 3.5.4 The performance security will be discharged by the KNATCOM and returned to the candidate not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the tenderer's performance of obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations under the contract.

3.6 Inspections and Tests

- 3.6.1 The KNATCOM or its representative shall have the right to inspect and/or to test the services to confirm their conformity to the Contract specifications. The KNATCOM shall notify the tenderer in writing, in a timely manner, of the identity of any representatives retained for these purposes.
- 3.6.2 The inspections and tests may be conducted on the premises of the tenderer or its subcontractor(s). If conducted on the premises of the tenderer or its subcontractor(s), all reasonable facilities and assistance, including access to drawings and production data, shall be furnished to the inspectors at no charge to the KNATCOM.
- 3.6.3 Should any inspected or tested services fail to conform to the Specifications, the KNATCOM may reject the services, and the tenderer shall either replace the rejected services or make alterations necessary to meet specification requirements free of cost to the KNATCOM.
- 3.6.4 Nothing in paragraph 3.7 shall in any way release the tenderer from any warranty or other obligations under this Contract.

3.7 **Payment**

3.7.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the tenderer under this Contract shall be specified in SCC

3.8 Interest on Delayed Payments

The Procuring Entity shall not in any instance whatsoever, incur any interest or additional costs from overdue amounts, if any, owed to the Tenderer regarding this procurement.

3.9 Prices

- 3.9.1 Prices charged by the contractor for services performed under the Contract shall not, with the exception of any Price adjustments authorized in SCC, vary from the prices by the tenderer in its tender or in KNATCOM request for tender validity extension as the case may be. No variation in or modification to the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties.
- 3.9.2 Contract price variations shall not be allowed for contracts not exceeding one year (12 months)
- 3.9.3 Where contract price variation is allowed, the variation shall not exceed 25%, of the original contract price.
- 3.9.4 Where the variation in contract price results to an increment by more than 25%, such variation shall be tendered for separately.
- 3.9.5 Where quantity variation of service is allowed, the variation shall not exceed 15% of the original contract quantity.
- 3.9.6 Price variation request shall be responded to by the procuring entity within 30 days of receiving the request.

3.10 Assignment

The tenderer shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under this contract, except with KNATCOM prior written consent.

3.11 Termination for Default

The KNATCOM may, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of Contract, by written notice of default sent to the tenderer, terminate this Contract in whole or in part:

- a) if the tenderer fails to provide any or all of the services within the period(s) specified in the Contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the KNATCOM.
- b) if the tenderer fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the Contract.
- c) if the tenderer, in the judgment of the KNATCOM has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the Contract.
- d) If the service rendered by the Tenderer do not conform to the Standards specified in the Contract

In the event the KNATCOM terminates the Contract in whole or in part, it may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, services similar to those undelivered, and the tenderer shall be liable to the KNATCOM for any excess costs for such similar services.

3.12 Termination of Insolvency

The KNATCOM may at the any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the contractor if the contractor becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the contractor, provided that such termination will not produce or affect any right of action or remedy, which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the KNATCOM

3.13 Termination for Convenience

- 3.13.1 The KNATCOM by written notice sent to the contractor may terminate the contract in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that the termination is for the KNATCOM convenience, the extent to which performance of the contractor of the contract is terminated and the date on which such termination becomes effective.
- 3.13.2 For the remaining part of the contract after termination the KNATCOM may elect to cancel the services and pay to the contractor on agreed amount for partially completed services.

3.14 Termination by Mutual Consent

By mutual written agreement, the Procuring Entity and the Tenderer may agree to terminate the contract. The agreement shall provide that the termination is by mutual agreement, the extent to which the contract is terminated and the effects of such termination on each party's obligations.

3.15 Resolution of disputes

KNATCOM and the contractor shall make every effort to resolve amicably by direct informal negotiations any disagreement or dispute arising between them under or in connection with the contract.

If after thirty (30) days from the commencement of such informal negotiations both parties have been unable to resolve amicably a contract dispute either party may require that the dispute be referred for resolution to the formal mechanisms specified in the SCC.

3.16 Governing Language

The contract shall be written in the English language. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract, which are exchanged by the parties, shall be written in the same language.

3.17 Force Majeure

The contractor shall not be liable *for* forfeiture of its performance security, or termination for default if and to the extent that its delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the Contract is the result of an event of Force Majeure.

Effect of Force Majeure:

If a Party is prevented from or delayed in performing an obligation hereunder by reason of Force Majeure the affected Party shall:

- (a) be relieved from the consequences of its failure to perform that obligation on a day-to-day basis;
- (b) promptly notify the other parties of the occurrence as soon as reasonably possible by email, telex or cable of the nature of the Force Majeure and the extent to which the Force Majeure suspends the affected party's obligations under this Agreement; and
- (c) use all reasonable endeavours to overcome the consequences of the event and resume performance of its obligations as soon as possible after the Force Majeure condition no longer exists.

3.18 Force Majeure Termination:

If an event of Force Majeure continues beyond a period of thirty (30) days, the Parties shall meet in good faith to consult, if no such solution is found, either Party shall be entitled to terminate the obligations of the Parties under the Contract which are affected by such Force Majeure by giving written notice of not less than seven (7) days to the other Party.

3.19 Limitation of Liability

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Procuring Entity, its officers, directors, employees, agents, and subcontractors, shall not be liable for any claims, losses, costs, or damages of whatsoever nature and howsoever arising to the Tenderer, and anyone claiming by, through, or under the Tenderer, resulting from or in any way related to this Contract from any cause or causes, including but not limited to any direct, indirect, general, special, punitive, incidental or consequential damages, loss of income or profit, loss of or damage to property, claims of third parties or other losses of any kind or character.

3.20 Applicable Law.

The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of Kenya unless otherwise specified in the SCC

3.21 Notices

Any notices given by one party to the other pursuant to this contract shall be sent to the other party by post or by fax or E-mail and confirmed in writing to the other party's address specified in the SCC A notice shall be effective when delivered or on the notices effective date, whichever is later.

3.22 Amendments

Any amendment of any term of the Contract entered into by the parties shall only be made by a written agreement between the parties, and such agreement shall be deemed to form an integral part of such Contract.

SECTION IV SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- Offer hassle-free domestic and international travel transfer services.
- Negotiate for —Best fare on the Dayl such as the lowest fare made available by an airline for the day of travel.
- Appoint dedicated technical personnel(s) to be responsible for KNATCOM air ticketing and related services
- Provide air ticketing services from 0730 to 16.30 hours during working days. In addition the Travel Agent shall provide a contact number, which shall be manned by an experienced travel consultant, for 24 hour emergency services, weekends and official holidays where required.
- Provide an information service to notify KNATCOM and the traveler of such events as airport closings, cancelled or delayed flights and strike situations as well as safety conditions, which may affect travel to any particular destination.
- Provide each traveler a complete, printed itinerary documents which includes the following: Flight number(s) and seat assignment(s) (if any); confirmed upgrade (if applicable); Departure and Arrival times for each segment of the trip; intermediate stops; Airport and other taxes; Visa required or not required; and any other information such as change in international date lines.
- Offer reasonable credit periods to KNATCOM, at least 30 days.
- Offer supplementary services upon request including but not limited to hotel reservations, airport transfers, tours and car hire services.
- To carry out investigations on any complaints from travelers and follow ups
- Advise on immigration procedures within and outside the country, health requirements and security advisories for all destinations requested by KNATCOM.
- Advice on the reliability, security and safety records of airlines.

- Processing of visas on behalf of KNATCOM employees upon request where personal appearance before visa issuing officer is not obligatory.

- The Travel Agent shall maintain computerized profiles of all frequent travelers, as designated or defined from time to time by KNATCOM, setting forth the traveler's preferences regarding airlines, seating and meal requirements, passport and credit card information, and such other information as is useful to facilitate such travelers travel arrangements.
